

Cancer Navigation at Mercy Cancer Center Jefferson

Regardless of a person's age or background, receiving a diagnosis of cancer can be frightening and overwhelming. Finding the best path forward can be difficult, especially while dealing with the stress of the diagnosis and all its implications.

Mercy's Oncology Nurse Navigation program is a service to guide our cancer patients and their families to recovery. A cancer navigator is an oncology-certified registered nurse who coordinates with the entire care team, as well as the patient and their family, to provide timely screening, diagnosis, treatment and support services.

"My nurse navigator eased all the stress I had," said Sheila Robinson, who was diagnosed in 2018 with Stage IV metastatic breast cancer. "She knows me by name and always asks if I need anything. I used to call her all the time with questions. She was with me through the whole process since I was told about my diagnosis and set up all my appointments. She even called my mom to explain everything to her."

Patients and their families are not charged for Nurse Navigation services. Mercy relies on philanthropic support to help sustain this vital program. Mercy Cancer Center Jefferson has two nurse navigators that each support an average of 250 patients per year, which is about half of all patients undergoing treatment.

Below are a few recent technologies made possible by your support:

SENTIMAG SYSTEM

Deploys a tiny metal "seed" to help doctors mark and remove small and early stage breast cancers with incredible precision. "The marker can be placed up to 30 days in advance, eliminating the need for additional tests and procedures on the day of surgery," said Diagnostic Radiology Specialist, Dr. Christine Ormsby. The Sentimag system is also less invasive and much more comfortable for patients when compared to traditional wire localisation.

BREAST SCANNER

Brings high quality imaging within the walls of the Operating Room so that images of breast specimens, lumps, and even whole breast tissues can be immediately captured and viewed. This allows surgeons the ability to assess and operate more quickly, and reduces the amount of time patients are under anesthesia.
