Patients don't have to leave our community to access high quality surgical care.

Our surgical teams can perform many procedures right here in Mountain View that are typically only available at large medical centers in bigger cities.

A new Ear Nose & Throat (ENT) Microscope

is giving surgeons a clearer, more detailed view during delicate procedures in the ears, nose and throat.



This microscope is especially beneficial when surgeons are working in tight, narrow spaces, such as when placing ear tubes.

More than **5000** patients a year will benefit from these new surgical technologies, made possible by your generous support of Mercy Health Foundation St. Francis.

A new Nerve Monitoring System

is helping surgeons reduce the risk of nerve damage by allowing them to locate nerves and monitor nerve function during surgery. For even the most experienced surgeons, nerves can be difficult to identify during procedures due to disease, a previous



operation, or variations in anatomy. This system is especially beneficial in head and neck surgeries, as well as Inspire[®] therapy, a newer procedure that offers an alternative to CPAP for patients with obstructive sleep apnea.

A new Phaco Cataract Surgery Device

is improving vision for patients with cataracts. Called phacoemulsification, or phaco for short, this machine delivers ultrasonic waves to soften and



break up the cloudy lens so that it can be removed and replaced with a new artificial lens. Surgeons are able to perform the procedure through a tiny incision in the eye.

More patients will receive life-changing procedures right here in Mountain View,

giving them **more time** to spend with loved ones.
