

On Valentine's Day, we celebrated the completion of the Emergency Room expansion at Mercy Hospital Oklahoma City. The \$2.6 million project was fully funded by local philanthropists Herman and LaDonna Meinders. The expansion includes a dedicated CT scanner to help ER physicians make quicker diagnoses.

Ongoing campaign for an advanced facility bringing together the top gastroenterologists, GI specialists, GI services and programs under one roof. It will be the first and only comprehensive center for GI health serving all Oklahomans.

Love Family Women's Center Celebrates Grand Opening

The Love Family Women's Center officially opened on Sunday, April 7, offering a host of new services for women of all ages. Celebrations, blessings and tours occurred the week prior to the center's opening. Mercy Health Foundation hosted a Grand Reveal on March 26, honoring those who generously donated to the campaign.

The new women's center was made possible by a long list of donors who supported the fundraising campaign – the largest in Mercy's history. Including the lead donation from the Tom and Judy Love family, campaign co-chairs Judy Love and Cathy Keating led the fundraising efforts, bringing in \$44 million to make the project a reality. "This campaign was led by women, for generations of women to come and there could be no better campaign co-chairs than Judy Love and Cathy Keating," said Lori Cummins, vice president of philanthropy, Mercy Health Foundation. "We could not be more grateful."

Jean and Holly Smith were two of the many guests who attended the Grand Reveal. Jean Smith is a past board member and long-time donor to the Foundation, and Holly is Jean's daughter-in-law. Holly and her husband Jared recently welcomed third child, Monica Noelle, in a labor and delivery room named in recognition of Jean and Bill Smith for their contributions to the women's center. More than 50,000 patients seek care at Mercy Hospital Oklahoma City ER annually, with nearly half requiring at least one CT scan during their visit.

"Our ER team provides incredible care, and having a CT scanner in the ER makes that care more streamlined for our patients and co-workers," said Dr. Lance Watson, Medical Director of the emergency department. "For stroke patients, getting a CT scan quickly is critical for providing lifesaving care and reducing the possibility of long-term disabilities."

The Meinders made the donation in honor of Dr. Vertrees Smith, Medical Director Emeritus Meinders Neuroscience Institute, in recognition of his decades of service to the community.

Dr. Smith joined the medical staff as a neurosurgeon in 1974 and was one of the founding providers of the Meinders NeuroScience Institute. He led the creation of Oklahoma's first comprehensive stroke center, Mercy's gamma knife radiosurgery center, and the Meinders Center for Movement Disorders.

"Dr. Smith's visionary leadership and compassion have had a direct impact on my life and countless others," said Herman Meinders. "His skill and dedication have advanced neurological care in Oklahoma for 50 years, saving thousands of lives."

The Meinders have also made a significant impact through their generosity. Since 2019, their total donations have earned them the honor of being Mercy Health Foundation Oklahoma City's largest contributors.

"Their compassion and selfless generosity has been transformational for Mercy and will impact the lives of countless Oklahomans for generations to come," Lori Cummins, VP of philanthropy.
