Community Responds to Need for a New Mobile Mammography Bus

For more than two decades, Mercy's Mobile Mammography program has provided more than 50,000 life-saving screening mammograms in 16 critically underserved communities and 17 area employers, spanning a 100-mile stretch of Highway 60 from Springfield to West Plains. But after 13 years on the road and logging more than 150,000 miles, our current Mammo Bus was spending more time out of service than on the road.

As you can imagine, a pause in service could mean a delay in detecting breast cancer. And the best way to survive breast cancer is to find it early. When the Breast Center team approached the Foundation about replacing the current Mammo Bus, we knew our community would respond in great ways.

The team at Wilson Logistics, along with owner Darrel Wilson, stepped forward with the lead gift to put a brand new Mammo Bus into service. As leaders in the transportation industry, Wilson Logistics realizes the importance of having a modern, dependable vehicle.

Tianna scheduled her first ever mammogram on the Mammo Bus, deciding to take advantage of the bus being on-site at her employer. But, she never expected the appointment she booked out of convenience would end up saving her life.

Tianna's screening revealed areas of concern. After her follow-up diagnostic mammogram and ultrasound, masses were identified in both breasts. Tianna underwent three biopsies which confirmed that she had breast cancer. She received chemotherapy, surgery and radiation with her surgeon, Dr. John Bumberry, by her side throughout her entire cancer journey. Dr. Bumberry was grateful to be the one to share the good news with Tianna that she was in remission. Tianna attributes her survival to her early detection screening on the Mammo Bus.

Thank you to all our donors and supporters who helped make the new Mammo Bus a reality. Be looking for it to hit the highway in the very near future.

Since 2016, WWAM has allocated more than \$350,000 for critical needs at Mercy, supporting the following items this year:

- Automated chest compression machine for the ER to assist with CPR
- LigaSure device for Labor & Delivery to shorten operative time, reduce bleeding and improve patient safety
- Vitals cart for the Breast Center to increase quality of care by capturing more accurate blood pressure readings prior to procedures
- Tonomoter device for Ophthalmology to assist physicians with early detection of glaucoma and eye pressure spikes after previous treatments
- Treadmill for Cardiopulmonary Rehab patients to aid in their recovery and rehabilitation following medical procedures
