After spending 76 days in the NICU, little Rumani was finally stable enough to go home. The only obstacle standing in the way of her discharge was the need for a specialized, and costly, car seat to safely transport her—a car seat her parents couldn't afford.

Hugh, a child life specialist in the ER, learned of Rumani's situation and stepped in to provide the needed resources from a fund established in his son's memory.

Hugh's son, Matthew, passed away suddenly at the age of six. In the midst of their grief, Hugh and Matthew's mother Michele knew
