

About Mercy

A young Irish woman named Catherine McAuley received an unexpected inheritance from a couple she lived with and for whom she provided care. She used those funds to open the first House of Mercy, serving impoverished women and children in Dublin, Ireland.

Catherine founded the Sisters of Mercy in 1831, a new kind of religious community one that lived outside cloistered walls. They devoted their lives to ministering to the sick, poor and uneducated. They set up 14 Houses of Mercy across Ireland and England in the span of 15 years. By 1853, the Sisters were working on several continents.

The Sisters of Mercy arrived in St. Louis in 1856 to help the poor and sick. Their mission continues today at Mercy Hospital Jefferson.

Our Commitment

Like the Sisters of Mercy before us, we are committed to providing high quality, compassionate health care to all those we serve, regardless of their ability to pay. On average each year, Mercy Jefferson provides more than \$10.5 million in charity care and additional community benefits, such as support groups, free health screenings and much more.

Technology

- MyMercy free service that allows patients to connect with their physicians, see medical information, view test results, renew prescriptions, and schedule appointments and e-visits online using a PC, tablet or smartphone
- Comprehensive Breast Health program features advanced technologies, such as SOFIA 3D Ultrasound, combined with compassionate care
- Mercy's Virtual Care Center is the world's first facility dedicated to telehealth. A team of physicians and medical staff assists in the care of patients from intensive care units to their homes









Mercy Hospital Jefferson's Current Priorities

Corporate gifts will help fund projects that transform health care in our community including Mental Health, Cancer Care and Women's and Children's Services.



According to the National Institute of Mental Health, just over 20% of American teens currently have, or have had, a debilitating mental health condition.

Mental Health

Funds will help adolescents and adults who don't have the means to pay and are uninsured or underinsured receive treatment, transportation, educational materials and/or medications they need.



Approximately 40% of women and men will be diagnosed with cancer at some point in their lifetime, according to the National Cancer Institute.

Cancer Care

Funds will provide patients with critical medications, screenings, biopsies and tests for patients in need. Funds will also support the Cancer Navigation program to meet the growing needs of the community.



The population of Jefferson County is over 224,000 with a 2.5% growth rate and a 26% increase in mothers choosing to have their babies delivered at Mercy Jefferson.

Women's and Children's Services

Funds will cover the cost of co-pays and essential care items for uninsured moms. Funds will also help provide the latest technology and equipment needed to care for newborns.
